Year 7 Catch Up Premium Expenditure 2013-14

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading and/or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

The school received **£13,000**

IMPACT

Maths	73%	96%
Reading	86%	96%
Writing	69%	92%

Children in the intervention program in mathematics who did not make expected progress were moved to an alternative program in year 8.

Of the four children still not achieving L4 in reading and mathematics, one has a statement of need, one had an attendance of below 60% in Y7 and missed much of the intervention program. The other two are operating at 3a in both subjects currently.

Of the original cohort, 1 student left the school in this academic year.
